**Enrollment Level:** Your initial offer is based on an assumption of full-time (12+ credits) enrollment. You will need to submit an Enrollment Adjustment Request form prior to the start of the term if enrolling in less than 12 credits.

**Enrollment Intensity:** Aid will be awarded and adjusted based on "enrollment intensity" or the percentage of full-time enrollment. Enrollment in 12 or more credits is considered full-time; anything less than 12 credits is considered part-time and grant funding will be prorated to match.

Example 1: If you enroll in 7 credits for the term, you will be awarded 7/12 (or 58%) of your grant aid for that term.

**Satisfactory Academic Progress:** For most financial aid types, students must be meeting Satisfactory Academic Progress requirements to maintain eligibility. The Rules and Requirements document outlining the specific metrics is available on the WVC financial aid website.

**Cost of Attendance:** The budget reflects the estimated cost of attendance associated with enrolling at Wenatchee Valley College for the year. It is determined by the state and includes allowances for tuition and fees, cost of books and supplies, housing and food, transportation, personal/miscellaneous and loan fees (if applicable). You cannot receive aid above this amount. The Student and Parent Contribution are determined by applying a federal need analysis formula to the information you provided on your aid application. Eligibility for need based financial aid is determined by subtracting the Student and Parent Contribution from the Budget Amount.

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### Washington State Aid – Conditions of Award

3. You must be enrolled in an eligible program and not be pursuing a degree in theology.
4. If you hold a bachelor's degree or the foreign equivalent, you are not eligible to receive state grant funds.
5. If you do not attend or if you withdraw from your classes, you may owe a repayment of all or part of any state funds you have received.
6. You must maintain the academic progress standards established by your institution in order to receive additional state aid.
7. There could be other circumstances that would require a repayment or reduction in your current award amounts.
8. You must meet all eligibility requirements for the state aid program(s) awarded.
9. The offer of this financial assistance is subject to, and conditioned upon, the availability of funds. Washington Student Achievement Council (WSAC) and the institution through which the grant, scholarship, or work study is awarded, reserve the right to withdraw, reduce, or modify the awards due to funding limitations or due to changes in circumstances which affect your eligibility for the program(s).
10. If you fail to cash your check containing state funds or pick up any remaining funds by the close of the academic year, the funds shall be returned to the program at WSAC and treated as funds declined by you.
