

WVC Conditions of Financial Aid

By accepting financial aid, you will be accepting of, and bound by, the following terms and certification statements.

1. To receive federal and state financial aid, you must be a citizen of the United States or an eligible non-citizen or meet the other criteria outlined in the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Exceptions: Undocumented, DACA, and some other non-citizen residents of Washington state may qualify for state financial aid by submitting the Washington Application for State Financial Aid (WASFA). DACA and other non-citizen residents of Washington who have an Employment Authorization Card may qualify for State Work Study. Financial aid is offered to provide assistance with educational expenses only.
2. You must apply, be admitted to, and enrolled in an eligible degree or certificate program at Wenatchee Valley College to receive financial aid. A list of eligible programs is available in the financial aid office.
3. Financial aid is initially offered for a full-time course load of 12+ credits. Students are still eligible for partial financial aid if enrolled in less than 12 credits but will require adjustments be made once you have enrolled in the respective quarter. It is your responsibility to notify the financial aid office of enrollment other than full-time.
4. If you withdraw, cease attending classes, do not carry the required number of credits or take less than 12 credits, you should notify the financial aid office. Adjustments to aid after disbursement due to schedule changes may require the repayment of part or all of the aid advanced to you for which you are no longer eligible.
5. You must make satisfactory academic progress to receive financial aid. Financial aid may be withheld or canceled for failure to make satisfactory progress. You must complete your degree within an established time frame and comply with the financial aid Satisfactory Academic Progress Policy.
6. You are required to make timely repayment of any loans you borrowed once your repayment period starts.
7. You must keep the financial aid office and registration office informed of your current address.
8. An offer of financial aid is dependent upon federal and state allocations to the college. Insufficient allocations to the college may result in a reduction in the amount of aid or a change in the type of aid offered to you.
9. Financial aid is based on information you provided in your financial aid application. You should report to the financial aid office any changes in your financial situation, including, but not limited to: changes in marital status, Washington state residency status, any additional income, scholarships or other funds you receive.
10. Financial aid will be used to pay tuition, fees and other allowable current year charges on your college account, unless you indicate otherwise to the financial aid office. Financial aid will not pay fines such as parking or library. Financial aid funds are designed to pay college related expenses only and cannot be used for things such as purchasing illegal drugs, personal investments or purchasing real estate.

Specific Washington State Aid Conditions:

By accepting WA state financial aid, you agree to the conditions listed below:

1. You must meet the requirements for Washington State residency.
2. You do not owe a repayment to any state grant or scholarship nor are you in default on a state student loan.
3. You must be enrolled in an eligible program and not be pursuing a degree in theology.
4. If you hold a bachelor's degree or the foreign equivalent, you are not eligible to receive state grant funds.
5. If you do not attend or if you withdraw from your classes, you may owe a repayment of all or part of any state funds you have received.
6. You must maintain the academic progress standards established by your institution in order to receive additional state aid.
7. There could be other circumstances that would require a repayment or reduction in your current award amounts.
8. You must meet all eligibility requirements for the state aid program(s) awarded.
9. The offer of this financial assistance is subject to, and conditioned upon, the availability of funds. Washington Student Achievement Council (WSAC) and the institution through which the grant, scholarship, or work study is awarded, reserve the right to withdraw, reduce, or modify the awards due to funding limitations or due to changes in circumstances that affect your eligibility for the program(s).
10. If you fail to cash your check containing state funds or pick up any remaining funds by the close of the academic year, the funds shall be returned to the program at WSAC and treated as funds declined by you.
